

SAVE THE DATE - Saturday 18th May 2024

Reflection and Quiet Day: 10-4pm At Liddington Village Hall

We have planned another day of reflection, quiet and prayer for this year which will be held on Saturday 18th May and led by Rev Moira Slack.

At the beginning of April/late March there will be a sign-up sheet to indicate whether you are hoping to come. As we will be liable for full payment of hiring the venue within 4 weeks of the date, we will need to make an early decision as to whether there is enough interest.

The last two events have been special times together in their different ways, so if you are thinking of coming along, even though it's a while away, please do pop the date in your diary.

LENT MATERIALS

Lent Groups – "The Difference Course"

This year Lent starts early on Wednesday 14th February and Stephen, Stuart and Trudie have been looking at a number of Lent courses and recommend "The Difference Course" as the focus for our church family study this Lent.

The 5-week course explores how to follow Jesus in a conflicted and complex world, looking at how we can be peace-makers and play our part in reconciliation for a just and flourishing world: "for God who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation" (2Cor5:18). It is God's reconciling work that is the focus of our Lenten journey and Easter celebration which makes this course particularly attractive for Lent.

Each session includes a film, Bible study, prayer, discussion and some kind of activity and lasts around 90 minutes. The sessions explore themes such as: God's call and equipping to transform relationships in a conflicted world; How to cross divides; Navigating disagreement; Practicing forgiveness within mess and complexity and Risking Hope such that it is transformative

The Different Course has been recommended and shared with small group leaders and some of the groups have confirmed that they will be following the material. If you do not belong to a small group, or your group is focusing on other material, then we will also be offering two courses led by Stephen, Stuart and Trudie over the Lent period – sign-up sheets now available.

From Dorcan Church ECC Single Congregation Local Ecumenical Partnership - Next Steps

This is a near repeat of the December 2023 notices, with an extended time deadline.

Our thanks to you all for participating in the October 2023 Congregational Meeting, in which we discussed the future of our Local Ecumenical Partnership. A paper was circulated on 16th November 2023 and some hard copies are still available in the two churches.

What's next?

Some very important feedback you provided is that you want our Ecumenical essence to be maintained if the LEP were to be dissolved. Our next step on this journey is to define in detail what we really mean by Dorcan Church's Ecumenical "essence", and to determine what would need to be in place for that to continue under a single-denominational structure. To achieve this, ECC is formulating a small group to focus on defining the requirements for a new kind of Ecumenical agreement (Local Ecumenical Co-operative Scheme, or LECS).

What will the group be doing?

The group will be responsible for collecting and documenting feedback from us all on how we wish to continue expressing our ecumenical essence going forward. E.g. communion settings from other traditions, Covenant service, visiting preachers. We expressed that these and other aspects are important to us and it is about getting these articulated, documented and agreed by our parent denominations so they are carried into the future.

This work is needed to create a draft document that will form the basis of a legally binding agreement between both denominations to ensure our Ecumenical essence lives on, whatever the structural and legal governance arrangements are. The group will be exploring questions such as:

What does it mean for us to be an Ecumenical church?What are the things we do, say and think which make us Ecumenical?

• What things are needed both spiritually and practically to help us retain our Ecumenical essence?

For clarity, it is important to note that the scope of the group is focused on collating raw feedback into a document and then preparing a draft Ecumenical agreement (we have a template) for consideration as part of any decision to cease the current structure of the LEP. It is not to make any decision on the future of the LEP.

Who will be in the group?

We are looking for a group of around 6 people to join Stephen, Trudie, our Church Warden and our Senior Steward (Diane Killick and Nathalie Marshall) to work on this. The aim is to prepare a first draft of a document explaining what Ecumenism means to us by mid-April 2024,

which will be circulated for further comments and feedback, although timing for this may now slip.

How can I sign up?

We need a range of views and experiences reflected in this group, so if you would like to be involved or to suggest someone (please ask them first!), please speak to Diane or Nathalie by Monday 22nd January. To enable the group to be of a size to work well, if more than six people are nominated then we will look to ECC to nominate the group, with particular attention to diversity in its many forms. Please pray for this group as we move forward with this work.
