

God has been so good to us in this journey together. Liz and I look forward to the opportunity to say our farewells in the weeks ahead, giving thanks to God and celebrating our shared story, before we move on from the Diocese.

The process has now started for a new Suffragan Bishop and we pray for those involved and the guiding of the Holy Spirit as a new appointment is made in due course.
