"Warm and welcome" spaces at St. Paul's and St. Timothy's – can you help?

Many of our current activities provide a "warm and welcome" place for people in our community to come together, receive a great welcome and to be warm. This winter Swindon Borough Council will be compiling a list of places for people to come to and many of our existing activities will be included.

The need for warm and welcoming places is likely to be significant this winter and we are exploring whether we are able to open our two centres at other times, particularly before or after other groups so we can maximise use of the cost of heating. Are there times you might be free to provide a warm and welcome place to others? Some of the initially more obvious times are:

- At St Paul's before the various early evening meetings in the small meeting room at St Paul's;
- At Tim's after Tiny Tots on Wednesdays and Food Collective on Fridays.

There are other times too and each session can be as long or short as you feel you can offer – the most important thing is that we are welcoming and engage with those who come – and drinks and cakes are always popular! If this is something you feel called to offer, please let Trudie or Stephen know and we can see if there are times we might be able to make this happen. Thank you.

Bring a Bulb Saturday

We are going to be planting bulbs to encouraging pollinating insects for the spring and to brighten up the front of the church and we would love for you to come and help. Bring a trowel, bulb planter and gloves if you have them.

If you are able to contribute some bulbs that would be greatly appreciated. For, example Bluebells, Alliums, Snowdrops, Winter Aconites, Crocus, Early Bulbous Iris, Grape Hyacinth/ Muscari, and some varieties of Daffodil. Please make sure the bulbs are marked as pollinator friendly as not all bulbs are.

ECO Tip

Get draft proof to stop loosing heat. Professional draught-proofing of windows, doors and blocking cracks in floors and skirting boards can cost around £200, but can save around £25 a year on energy bills. Tearfund Notice

At our Harvest Festival Service at St Pauls, Stephen spoke about the effects of climate change on other parts of the world and showed a video from Tearfund about the problems people in Burkina Faso face. Tearfund is a Christian charity which partners with churches in more than 50 of the world's poorest countries. They tackle poverty and injustice through sustainable development, by responding to disasters and challenging injustice. Tear Fund believe an end to extreme poverty is possible.

One way we can help Tear fund is by supporting their campaigns. In our services we pray for our political leaders asking for them to have wisdom and guidance, and to act to prevent climate change and reduce poverty. However, something we as individuals and a church are maybe not so good at is holding our leaders to account for what they have said they will do and telling them what we believe they should be doing.

Tearfund are asking us to Send a Coin to the Prime Minister to remind her and the government to follow through on the promises made to provide finance to fight climate change. It will only cost you a stamp and a coin. There is a letter you can print out or write your own version of at Send a coin to the Prime Minister - Tearfund or there will be more information and letters at St Timothy's and St Pauls Church for the next three weeks.
