DUST GLORY A Lent journey of faith, failure and forgiveness

This Lent, the preaching team recommend to you the 2023 "Big Church Read" Lent theme book called *"Failure: what Jesus said about sin, mistakes and messing stuff up"* (*by Bishop Emma Ineson*). The Lent material from the Church of England – Dust and Glory – is based on this book and each day there is a reflection and prayer which can be accessed by email, app, telephone and in a booklet – we have some of these booklets for those who would prefer printed material and they will be available from Sunday 19th February.

In addition, a Lent course is offered on the theme and as a church we will be hosting some small groups across 6 weeks to explore the material and, on the Sunday before, the week's theme will be briefly introduced across services. Some existing home groups may follow this material (please do ask your leader) and for those who are either not in a home group or whose group is following a different theme, there are some options for you to join a group for Lent. Mother's Day Runaways


7:30pm Thursday 16th March At Rodbourne Methodist Church

Over the past six years, we have been encouraged to share insights, stories and reflections in order to contribute to the Bishops' discernment about matters of identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage – known as Living in Love and Faith. The 5-week course of the same name which was offered across the Deanery was a part of that.

This week, from 7-10th February, General Synod will be considering the Bishops' initial response and voting on it. The full details are electronically attached (or printed), together with two pastoral letters from both +Viv and +Lee who share their differing personal positions with grace and love.

The proposals that will be put to synod this week can be summarised as follows:

A formal apology has been extended to our LGBTQI+ brothers and sisters for how they have been treated – with many excluded or rejected by the church;

The definition of Marriage will not be changed and teaching remains that it is a life-long commitment between one man and one woman;

New *"Prayers of Love and Faith":* This resource will offer clergy a variety of flexible ways to affirm and celebrate same-sex couples in church, and will include prayers of dedication, thanksgiving and for God's blessing. The use of these prayers will be entirely discretionary - clergy may choose to use some combination of these prayers or not to use them at all;

New pastoral guidelines: These will be offered later this year, and will review past guidance relating to issues of sexuality, sexual intimacy, civil partnerships and marriage. It will also involve Identifying and addressing areas where there is little or no guidance – for example, regarding singleness and celibacy. Guidelines will also be reviewed regarding the requirement of celibacy for clergy and those in authorised positions in same-sex relationships

For some, these proposed changes go too far, for others not far enough. This will be debated with deep conviction and passion this week and whatever the conclusion there will be a challenging path ahead. Many will be watching on this week as this comes to Synod and is reported in the press so please do pray for them - for the Holy Spirit to guide; that respect, grace and love are shown in abundance - in both agreement and disagreement; and that General Synod may be a good witness to the love of Jesus in a broken world.

For us to be able to focus our mission and energy on Messy, ECC has agreed that on one of the Sundays each quarter we will not be holding a 10:30am service at St Paul's, although there will be a communion service at 8:45am. Please can we ask you to pray for Messy church and the team? Clare Smith will be co-ordinating going forward – thank you Clare - and as she takes up the baton, we thank Deb for all that she has done to keep Messy alive, especially during the pandemic – thank you Deb!
