

Prayer Board

As you may know, there is a Prayer Board at St Paul's (on the wall to the left as you enter the Worship area), and you are invited to put requests for prayers on it.

Please ensure you have the appropriate permission before putting up any requests, in particular if you mention anyone's name. Please also include your name and the date you put up the request.

Prayers will be left for two weeks before being removed in order to keep the board up to date, if prayer is still needed please use another piece of paper and repeat the request.

General prayers will be offered in worship for the specific prayers on the board, but names will not be mentioned at the moment as the worship is live streamed and then available on the web.

And don't forget, there is also a board for answers to prayer, please us this too.

ECO Tip 12

Increasingly, professional gardeners are calling for us all to avoid peat based composts. Not only is peat extraction destroying habitat but peatlands are also carbon sinks, holding on to more CO2 than trees and so essential to efforts to slow climate change. Composts which are not marked will contain Peat. Seek out Peat free to know categorically that it doesn't contain peat.

Jubilee celebrations:


