**Swindon Christmas Toy Appeal – distribution co-ordinator from St Paul's

In the last few years we have gifted toys to this appeal, previously coordinated by Gateway Church. In 2021 923 children received gifts - this was 200 more than the previous year and the need is likely to be even greater this Christmas. This year the appeal will be working differently. The idea is for a number of local churches to receive a selection of toys and for local people to then visit, bringing with them a voucher (similar to Food Collective) to choose a gift. This enables connections to be made locally.

Dorcan church has taken a step of faith and agreed to be a distribution centre for East Swindon, using the meeting room off the main hall which can also be accessed from outside. We are looking for a coordinator to receive the gifts from the central storage point (they will be bought to us, together with storage solutions) and to draw up a rota of lovely volunteers to man the room when people visit to choose their presents. It is at our discretion as to when we open so we can do what works best for us and the team. Gifts will be ready for choosing from Monday 12th December, up until Christmas, with the last day being at our convenience.

If you feel this is something you would like to support and might be able to co-ordinate, then please do speak with Trudie. We already have three willing volunteers for your team! Thank you.

Many of our current activities provide a "warm and welcome" place for people in our community to come together, receive a great welcome and to be warm. This winter Swindon Borough Council will be compiling a list of places for people to come to and many of our existing activities will be included.

The need for warm and welcoming places is likely to be significant this winter and we are exploring whether we are able to open our two centres at other times, particularly before or after other groups so we can maximise use of the cost of heating. Are there times you might be free to provide a warm and welcome place to others? Some of the initially more obvious times are: at St Paul's - before the various early evening meetings in the small meeting room at St Paul's; at Tim's – after Tiny Tots on Wednesdays and Food Collective on Fridays. There will be other times too and it can be as long or short as you feel you can offer – the most important thing is that we are welcoming and engage with those who come – and drinks and cakes are always popular! If this is something you feel called to, please let Trudie or Stephen know and we can see if there are times we might be able to make this happen. Thank you.
