ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Date of our Annual General Meeting – 14th May 2023: Our AGM will be held after our 10:30am service at St Paul's, starting around 11:45am. Our meeting will be a maximum of an hour, and we will receive the annual report, elect officers and tend to our legal business. A particular focus this year will be offered from the Finance Committee who will be guiding us through a more in depth review of our finances. Talking about money can be hard and we may not feel confident with "numbers". However it is important that, as a church, we understand our financial position — both giving thanks for all of God's provision and committing to pray when we are challenged financially. There will be time for questions, so please do come with some! Please do put this AGM date in your diary and come along.

Receiving Communion at St Paul's – changes to our pattern

Going forward we will be continuing in our practice of receiving wine by the dipping of the wafer in the wine by the celebrant, or receiving from the silver common cup or, for a small number of people, a non-alcoholic option. However, this practice can mean that the people around us come and go at different times which can be disruptive in this special, quiet time. At a recent preachers' meeting, we agree that we would look to try a different way of coming for communion and we share this with you as follows, and will try it this coming Sunday:

A steward will come to the row where you are sitting and invite you to come forward to receive. Please would you come to one of the two sides around the table where the railings and kneelers are. However, please keep the area at the front of the communion table free where there are no kneelers or rails – this is a change to our current practice. When you have received communion, please remain at the rail until everyone on your side has received and we will then offer a short prayer of dismissal to return to your seats. Those distributing communion will then move across to the other rail, for the same to be repeated.

We will explain it again over the next few weeks and then review whether this is helpful to the ambience and practicalities of communion. Thank you for trying it out and feedback is welcome.


