Transforming Church Together (TCT)

Transforming Church Together (TCT)

Back in January 2021 Bristol Diocese began a process called Transforming Church Together (TCT) – you may remember the online engagement we held as a church where we were asked a number of questions by a facilitator. After a year of engagement across the Diocese, prayer and discussion including connecting with our communities and less-heard groups, the strategy then entered a period of discernment. This brings us to today and we now have a road map for the priorities for the Diocese going forward.

The strategy is supported by a substantial £8m+ bid into the national Church of England. TCT will be embedded within the Diocese and will drive the priorities for resources and energy going forward. We are invited to consider how TCT might enrich and support us in the mission and ministry of the local church here in Dorcan and to consider which areas we might wish to engage with.

Your ECC are starting to consider this in our next meeting on 23rd January and in the months ahead, with an eye also to how this might connect with the Methodist strategic focus of "New People, New Places". Some information has now been made available which we would like to draw your attention to and encourage you to read.

There are three brochures as follows which you will find on-line at https://www.bristol.anglican.org/visionandpriorities/transforming-church/. In each of the two centres there are also a few hard copies, and please do contact Maggie if these run out:

Vision and Values: Outlines the broad vision for the future, and our working values as we find a path forward;

Next steps: An outline of how TCT will move forward and the planning ahead;

Strategy summary: a booklet outlining the main objectives and 12 strategic activities to achieve these. It is these activities we are particularly looking at to how we might engage with TCT that is right for us, and what resources and energy we might require.

At this stage we are asking you to start to digest and consider what TCT might mean for us? ECC are considering the following questions which may help you as you ponder:

What excites you about the strategy?
What concerns do you have about the strategy?
How might you see Dorcan Church engaging in the strategy?
What parts are particularly important within our local context?
What questions do you have?

We would love to hear your feedback and thoughts. Please do speak with any member of ECC with your ideas and ponderings and they can then share who you are and your thoughts with ECC. In the meantime if you have any questions on the general strategy and process please do speak with Trudie. Please do commit this strategy to prayer as it will be a significant part of our mission and ministry going forward.

Eight million stitches expressing God's love!

'Threads through Creation' is an extraordinary, uplifting art exhibition at Bath Abbey, on show from 7th January until 19th March as part of a nationwide tour of 20 cathedrals and churches.

It took Christian textile artist Jacqui Parkinson three years - and eight million stitches!

The show consists of twelve beautiful silk panels re-imagining the story of creation from Genesis. You've read it in black and white – now see it in amazing colour! The panels are huge (2.7m high, up to 3.5m wide) and truly breath-taking.

It's a great opportunity for sharing with friends – bring along some non-Christians, and there'll be some interesting conversations! Everyone comes out buzzing ...
