Church Family Christmas Cards

Many of us are now starting to write Christmas cards (or at least thinking about it!). This year there is again the opportunity to send one card to the whole church family, particularly as we look to be an ECO church. Instead of displaying on a board, we invite you to stand your church family Christmas card on top of the Bible cupboard at St Paul's and/or on one of the tables at St Timothy's – we can then more easily see the picture and message inside. If you are giving individual cards, please can we ask that you hand them to the recipient rather than leaving out at both centres for hopeful collection? There are often a number left after Christmas that don't get to those they are addressed to which is a pity. (and not leaving them around will also make for happy stewards!)

Confirmation: Are you interested in being confirmed?

Confirmation is a special service where we "confirm" the promises made when we are baptised. If you were baptized as a child, your parents and godparents would have made these promises on your behalf. At a confirmation service, we make these promises of faith anew for ourselves, supported by friends and family and the local Christan community. Are you interested in exploring possible confirmation and would like to talk about it? If so, please do have a chat with Trudie, Stephen or Stuart.

Alpha Course opportunity: If you're interested, or can help with practicalities (see below) please grab Stephen or Trudie

Alpha is a series of sessions that freely explore the basics of the Christan faith over 11 weeks. Each session has food, a short video and a chat at the end where you can share your thoughts and questions, and there is no charge. A group of seven of us are joining with Pattern Church's Alpha course starting Wednesday evenings from 7.00pm - 9.15pm on 15th January and there is plenty of room for others to join if you are interested. The idea is that we will host our own Dorcan Church table and any chat would be between ourselves, with either Stephen or Trudie on the table too. Lifts can be provided. If at any point you decide that Alpha isn't for you, that is not a problem at all – there is really no pressure at all. If you are interested, then please do grab Trudie or Stephen for more information.

Can you help - being a helper on the night or by providing cakes?

- Helpers: When we join Pattern Church we will have our own Dorcan table which Stephen and/or Trudie will be leading. However, it would be good to have a helper on the table too, to support with practicalities on the night. Might you be able to help on some of the evenings please?
- Cake bakers: Each church attending is asked to bring cakes to share. Are you able to support by providing some cakes for Wednesday evenings now and again please?
