

We are all invited to this gathering to share and discern what is important and precious to us ecumenically so that we can include these aspects in a new kind of Ecumenical agreement (Local Ecumenical Co-operative Scheme, or LECS) as we define our future. ECC recognises the importance of expressing and documenting what is important to us, but we do need your help. We therefore invite you to a congregational meeting on **26th February**, **7pm at St Timothy's**, to share and explore this amongst ourselves.

To help us think about this, before the meeting we are all encouraged to think and pray about what it is specifically in our current ecumenical worship that:

- we value, and
- what we wish to continue when Dorcan comes under the legal governance of the Church of England

It may help to consider this under some of the following headings, but please don't limit yourselves to these aspects:

Communion practice
Ministry of Methodist Local Preacher and Ministers
Ministry of Licensed Lay Ministers
Styles of worship
Other aspects

At our meeting we will also share an update on where we are and answer your questions, where able. Your input is vital as we draw up the LECS document and it needs to be shaped by us all, so that it is ours. We do hope you are able to come - and there will be cake (and some healthy things)! Please do continue to pray, think, talk, discuss as we continue this path into our future.
