We are pleased to share that the 2022 Toy Appeal was launched earlier this week. The aim is to bring some hope and happiness to families who would find giving presents to their children very difficult without resorting to loans, and especially this year with the cost of living proving challenging.

This year the distribution to families is being made locally to encourage connection with the local church family. Through St Paul's, Dorcan church is a significant part of enabling the appeal to happen this year as we will be one of four distribution points across Swindon. Last year 363 families were supported, with a total of 923 children and we expect this year to be busier.
