Rhythm of Life – exploring spiritual traditions throughout 2025

New resources have just been released this week by Bristol Diocese to explore different spiritual traditions and practices. Each month there is a taster of the many different types of Christian spirituality, and these can be accessed online through videos and other resources, which you will find at **Rhythm of Life - Diocese of Bristol** (there is also a QR code to access the webpage in the flyers – see below). In addition, there is also a session called "bring and share" each month over zoom on Thursday evenings for an hour – this is a chance to share and discuss together. The resources can be explored on our own or with others, yet it's often easier to sustain a rhythm of life with others as apart of a community, so why not link up with others and journey together? **If you're part of a small group, maybe consider using some of the resources in your gathering?**

There is more information in flyers that you'll find in both centres and we have been provided with one for each person. You'll see in there that there is a general introduction on zoom on 2nd January 2025 at 7pm, repeated at 8:30pm There is a QR code on the booklets to give the link to Eventbrite to book up, or you alternatively can go onto Eventbrite here: <u>Rhythm of Life: Bring & Share Tickets</u>, <u>Multiple Dates | Eventbrite</u> The good news is that the sessions will be repeated again in 2026, so we can start the journey of the rhythm of life at any time. It looks a good thing to be a part of, so do pick up some information and consider joining the journey into 2025.

Confirmation: Are you interested in being confirmed?

Confirmation is a special service where we "confirm" the promises made when we are baptised. If you were baptized as a child, your parents and godparents would have made these promises on your behalf. At a confirmation service, we make these promises of faith anew for ourselves, supported by friends and family and the local Christan community. Are you interested in exploring possible confirmation and would like to talk about it? If so, please do have a chat with Trudie, Stephen or Stuart.

Alpha Course opportunity: If you're interested, or can help with practicalities (see below) please grab Stephen or Trudie

Alpha is a series of sessions that freely explore the basics of the Christan faith over 11 weeks. Each session has food, a short video and a chat at the end where you can share your thoughts and questions, and there is no charge. A group of seven of us are joining with Pattern Church's Alpha course starting Wednesday evenings from 7.00pm - 9.15pm on 15th January and there is plenty of room for others to join if you are interested. The idea is that we will host our own Dorcan Church table and any chat would be between ourselves, with either Stephen or Trudie on the table too. Lifts can be provided. If at any point you decide that Alpha isn't for you, that is not a problem at all – there is really no pressure at all. If you are interested, then please do grab Trudie or Stephen for more information.
