COVID-19 Advice on the Conduct of Public Worship

On the 19th May, the governing body of the Church of England updated their policy on advice for Public worship, in regards to the government opening Step 3 of the 4 step programme out of Lockdown. For *The Dorcan Church*, this means that there are NO CHANGES and ALL current safety measures are to remain in place. Despite a relaxation of rules in homes and in some public spaces, those attending public worship MUST NOT, congregate in larger groups, share the Peace (by hugging) or greet each other in this way.

Other denominations who use Church of England buildings to meet for worship are asked to adhere to the same advice.

Living in Love and Faith (LLF) Diocese of Bristol: Next Steps.

Commissioned and led by the Bishops of the Church of England, Living in Love and Faith (LLF) is about encouraging the whole church to think more deeply about identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage in the bigger context of being human. It is an invitation to people, whatever their background and experience, to think more deeply about what it means to be human and to live in love and faith together. It's about understanding different perspectives and each other better. We hope it will change the way people relate to, understand and love each other in the church, even when we disagree. In our local context, it is about committing to a five-week or five- session course designed to help people to listen and learn together. If you would like to engage with this further, after this introduction session, we will be taking it forward locally; please let Rev Stuart Fisher know your interest so that we can buy enough course packs for everyone. We hope face-to-face small group(s) can also be arranged for those who do not use 'Zoom' or the internet.
