Please note that they currently have plentiful supplies of cereal, pasta, tinned soup and baked beans. Congregational Meeting from 17th October – notes now available Thank you to those able to attended the gathering last month where we continued exploring how we might structure ourselves and express our ecumenical identity in the future. At that meeting we said that we would share some notes by the end of November outlining the discussions from our time together, answering questions raised where able, and providing some more information where we could following our subsequent meeting with Archdeacon Christopher and Superintendent David Gray. These notes were circulated electronically on 16th November and there are paper copies available in both centres for those who do not receive emails.

Our next ECC meeting is on Monday 27th November and we will be looking at gathering a group to start the work of drafting a Local Ecumenical Co-operative Scheme – a formal document which will detail how we wish to express ourselves ecumenically. This work will be focused in the first quarter of next year and during that time we will look to hold another congregational meeting to explore further some of the detail of what is important to us – a task we started at this recent meeting. Therefore it will be into the new year before there is any further developments to share. **PTO**
