ECO Tip 10

This weekend is the middle of Fairtrade Fortnight. The Fairtrade criteria includes ecological criteria so it is worth looking out for even just from the eco point of view. Although Rainforest Alliance, Organic etc. are seen as stronger eco certifications, and Fairtrade as a people centered certification, in reality Fairtrade covers both bases. Fairtrade fortnight is a great time to look out for special deals on Fairtrade products too – and don't forget to look for Fairtrade easter eggs if you haven't already ordered Real Easter Eggs via Stephen Roe.

Have you thought of being confirmed?

On 8th May at 4pm we have the privilege of hosting the Ecumenical Confirmations at St Paul's. Confirmation is a significant moment in our Christian journey and can take on differing significances for us – for some it is an affirmation of our faith following baptism as a child when others made promises on our behalf; for others it is part of our adult baptism; for some it is when we chose to take our first communion; and it can also mark membership of the church and a particular denomination.

If you haven't yet been confirmed, is this something you might like to consider as part of your Christian journey?
