Update on Covid Measures Plan B to Plan A from Thursday 27th January 2022

Firstly, a big thank you for your continuing understanding and support as we commit to keeping each other safe as we journey through Covid. All the changes and thinking can be exhausting at times can't it?!

As the government makes its decision to move from Plan B to Plan A, standing committee have discussed our response. In our considerations, we have been conscious that the rates of Covid are still extremely high and Swindon currently is above the both the averages for the nation and the South West. At the current time, we have therefore made two changes to our risk assessment as follows:

- Masks: whilst no longer a legal requirement under plan A, we would please encourage the continuing wearing of masks if you are able. Thank you.
- Ventilation: The doors to the outside will no longer be required to be open. However, as ventilation is a significant mitigator in the transmission of covid, we will continue to open the screen at St Paul's and the spreading out of chairs in both centers.

Thank you for your support in enabling us to worship together safely and if you have any questions or concerns please do speak to a member of the Standing Committee.

Update on Covid Measures Plan B to Plan A from Thursday 27th January 2022

Summary

Practicalities when gathering

- Whilst no longer a legal requirement under plan A, we would please encourage the continuing wearing of masks, if you are able.
- We also continue to encourage the use of LFTs before gathering please, if you are able.
- At St Paul's the screens will continue to be opened with rows of chairs spaced out into the hall. The printed x and Ö signs will still be available for you to place next to you to indicate whether you are happy or not for people to sit next to you;
- At St Tim's, some chairs will be removed to aid distancing. In both centers signing in and/or QR codes will continue to be used
- If there is the capacity and energy amongst those willing to serve tea and coffee, then refreshments may be offered after services. However, we all need to be mindful of proximity to others as we talk, particularly as we need to take masks off to drink and eat.

Our employees - Jenny and Maggie

Maggie, our Church administrator and Jenny, our centre manager, will be working in the office at separate times throughout the week. If you come into the centre to see them, we ask that you continue to follow our previous guidance and wear a mask, knock on the office door and wait to be either invited in, or asked by them to meet in a more open space.

Standing Committee



On Sunday the 23rd January we started our work on Eco Church. In case you missed the talk during the service here is a quick summary of what was said. There is a longer version on our website.

Our parent Churches the Methodist Church and the Church of England have made clear commitments to ensure the church plays it part in helping to protect the environment and encouraging other

people to do. They aim to reach net zero by 2030. The Dorcan Ecumenical Church Council has agreed to commit to work towards Net Zero and helping to protect the environment and has joined a scheme called Eco Church to help us

Eco Church is designed to help churches improve their environmental impact. It helps us look at different areas of our Church life to see what we are already doing, then consider what

else needs doing and to act accordingly.

The survey covers all areas of church life:

Worship and Teaching

Management of Church Buildings

Management of Land

Community and Global Engagement Lifestyle.

It challenges churches about all parts of our life from the songs we sing and the food we serve; How much energy we use and of the ethics of our investments; how we use our land and about the water that flushes our loss; and so on

water that flushes our loos; and so on.

As we complete the survey, we collect points towards an Eco Church Award. There are three levels of Eco Church Award – Bronze, Silver and Gold. As we do actions in each of the areas, we amass more points and can gain a higher award. Our aim is not to

achieve a Gold Award but to do everything we can to protect God's world and encourage inspire each other and our community to as well.

Neil Marshall is our Eco Champion (He didn't choose the title) and Deacon Stephen Roe is leading on behalf of the Ministry Team.
